Precious Moments with Dr. Tejasvini Arvind Patil IFS

The Chief Guest of Annual Day



Q. How were you known by your teachers?

I was good in studies, sports & extracurricular activities. So I think the teachers liked me.

Q. What difficulties did you face in achieving your goal in life?

No difficulties as such.

Q. What inspired you to choose IFS as your career when you had already done PGs in different fields?

I am from Mumbai and felt that a career in the forest wildlife was more appealing than an office 9-5 job.

Q. How do you find your so many varied qualifications beneficial for your present career?

The qualifications are all theoretical and the career has the practical application of all these. Whatever I have learned from Law to Science to Statistics has all found an application in the job I do.

Q. How do you deal with failures if any in your life?

There are really no failures. Each experience adds to your life as a learning lesson and helps you grow. Positive or negative is just a perception of the mind and the situation.

Q. Was there any turning point in your life? If any can you share with us?

Turning point would be the day I reported for the job at when I was 22.5 yrs old. It was the sobering realisation that I was now expected to contribute to the society as a responsible and mature individual and that the childhood days are done.

Q. Did you face any discrimination at any point of life being a woman?

No discrimination as such. In fact I have observed that my staff and seniors always were more positive and supportive of me.

Q. What advantages do you get being a woman administrator?

Personally I feel that an officer is an officer irrespective of gender.

Q. What is your aim as a forest officer?

To ensure that the forest wealth is responsibly and legally utilized in such a way that the dependent environment wildlife and human communities all benefit sustainably.

Q. What are the hurdles /challenges you face in Uttarakhand regarding conservation of forests?

Here there is such an abundance of forest wealth that the people take their asset very casually.

Q. What challenges are you facing in combating/resolving the problems related to smuggling and poaching in forest department?

Right now staff shortage and recruitment of frontline staff is an ongoing issue.

Q. What will be the role of forest officers in making India a developed country?

Forest officers' responsibility is to ensure that the forest wealth remains available. It's a dynamic resource of primary products from timber to RBM to Oleo Pine resin to medicines etc. also the intangibles air quality, water etc.

Q. What has your profession so far taught you?

Any government service actually requires the officer to optimally balance local aspirations requirements within the legal frameworks so that the rules are followed and people's genuine requirements also get satisfied.

Q. Do you ever find any difficulty in balancing the role of a forest officer and a mother or a wife?

No.

Q. What is your pastime?

I like reading books, cooking, drawing & painting.

Q. What was the feeling when you were invited for the first time as a Chief Guest?

It's always an enjoyable experience to see children perform in all their innocence and earnestness.

Q. How will the society remember you, when you retire?

As someone who did her duties fairly and successfully.

Q. What do you think is the reason of abject degradation in moral values in the land of Vedas, Ram, Krishna, Vivekananda and Gandhi?

Today the youth is not developing core values, moral maturity and taking responsibility. Especially in cities they are near collapse in parental care giving. Leaving young children in crèches etc is certainly not going to instil moral values in them.

Q. What is to be expected from a perfect school as a parent?

That it offers opportunities to the children to develop their full potential mentally/physically and to guide and also discipline them.

Q. Had you been the education minister of India what changes would have you brought in the education system?

To develop a system where children are allowed to explore, use and develop their brains rather than just learning by rote and cramming stuff.

Q. What is your message:-

For the girls - do what makes you internally happy.

For the youth of India - understand the responsibility to the Nation.

For the teachers - to open up the students minds and not just cram information into them.

For the parents - to actually give time to their children instead of mobiles and T.V.s.
